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Abstract: As more states legally permit assisted suicide as a clinical option in end-of-life care, confusion persists regarding the ethics and policy surrounding care for the dying patient, including the role that clinicians are expected to play. Currently, the Pennsylvania state legislature is considering a bill to legalize physician assisted suicide. This workshop will consider, discuss, and evaluate the ethical, clinical, and legal issues associated with assisted suicide and care for the dying in the U.S., as well as those peculiar to Pennsylvania.
